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Program Name: Pre-Apprenticeship Pilot Program and Short-term vocational course series

The Director continues to mentor the 8 pre-apprenticeship students, talking to employers. All employers have been set up and contracted and are documenting workers attitudes, work ethic, skills, etc. We are set to soon have our next student and employer meeting.

The Director is waiting on replacing the retired coordinator because the needs have changed. Will resolve issue with Corlei.

The 4-wk short term vocational classes continue to be a popular, filling each time offered. In Spring we will offer the 2nd (intermediate) series of them. (The first series: CT NC 001 Construction Framing, CT NC 002 Construction Finish Carpentry, CT NC 003 Construction Electrical, CT NC 004 Construction Plumbing. The second, more advanced, series is CT NC 011 Intermediate Construction Framing, CT NC 012 Intermediate Construction Finish Carpentry, CT NC 013 Intermediate Construction Electrical, and CT NC 014 Construction Measuring and Estimating.)

Students now being served by pre-apprenticeship program: 4 from 1st cohort and 4 from 2nd cohort. Non-credit students being served by short-term vocational course series: approx 20 per class for each time offered. We expect this to continue through this coming academic year.
